

Please remember that all changes in your child's transportation need to be in writing. It is very difficult to make changes at 2:15. Parents are making calls at the last minute and that is really causing a problem. If it is an emergency, of course, by all means, feel free to call, but regularly,

the children need to know their method of transportation home before they get to school in the morning. By 2:15 the children are changing classes to prepare for dismissal and we pray and start transitioning at 2:20 to specific car lines, bus lines etc, for a smooth dismissal by 2:25. So if you have to make a change, please call by 2:00. Also, if your child is a car rider and you are late in picking them up any later than 2:40, they will be sent to EDP and you will have to pay the charge. On half days, the lateset to pick up is 12:25, before we send them to EDP. We really need to get these procedures under control. The teachers and I have faculty meetings frequently after dismissal, and we cannot leave the children unattended. Once again, it is all for order and safety for the children.
